A better movie by that point is something like the original Gremlins. If I were in a conversation where you could say you were interested in seeing something, and they said "oh, we'd love to see that", I'd respond saying "I'll watch that for you, I don't have anything else to do". Well yes, some of the stories were very poor and the dialogue was never this good, but most of the movies on this list had the opportunity to be good and they failed. And that's a failing of the ones that were done. I mean, yeah, the TV series on HBO was pretty bad, but it was done as a limited series with only a few episodes. That has limited exposure and so only made it to half a dozen people, which is much less than the 30 million who watched The Sopranos. I liked the original Tarzan and the movies were decent enough. But as you point out, they borrowed the source material shamelessly. I even had a copy of The Complete Works of Tarzan on my shelf (which also borrowed shamelessly). But I got the books at the library and was left wondering what happened to these characters. I've never seen The Lord of the Rings nor the Hobbit. I do like the movies made from these novels, and while they borrowed shamelessly, they also made sure to not just reinvent their characters, but to develop them anew. But we all know any Batman story where Joker isn't involved, any Superman story where Lex Luthor is dead, any Aliens story where no one ever refers to the space-alien-first-contact ritual, any Ocean's movies without a shark, and so on. Thats one thing I don't like about the reboot culture: it forgets that its good to let something lie in the past.

I think the language of the movie is more literary than TVTropes, but I do think its one of the best features of this movie. There is a lot of talk about the central idea that there is a Necromancer (Jedi) who is an evil force out to destroy Middle Earth. It does not come out until late in the movie when Gandalf does not feel like shooting the Necromancer and then immediately admits that he failed; its a powerful line that really comes together nicely. It was fun, had some beautiful views to look at, and its quite funny at times. And don't tell me that some one in your family didnt want to come see it with you. I know some ppl who did, cuz they told me all about it after. I couldnt pull my eyes off the big screen! It was disconcerting when I put my phone down and realized that there was more to this movie than the 5 minutes I had just seen. I hope they get away with this without suffering.
